Founded in 1998, after several years of operating as the East African Wildlife Society, Uganda Chapter, the Uganda Wildlife Society has been at the forefront of active conservation in Uganda. What we do

As a Society, we strive to conserve Uganda's wildlife and the environment by:

- ◆ Influencing policy formulation for environmental management.
